

FROM THE CHAIRMAN

Dear Friends,

At present our Branch is focused on the forthcoming Choristers' Camp, this year being held at the Western Australian College of Agriculture, Narrogin. Lucas Phillips and his team have been working hard organising the camp, and it will be my pleasure to direct the music. On 11 June we had a pleasing attendance at our fundraising concert for the Camp, held this year at St Patrick's Anglican Church, Mount Lawley. As well as raising money by selling tickets to the concert, we are grateful to have been supported by donations to the Camp, including one sizeable donation that was given to us by one person attending the concert. We are also delighted to acknowledge substantial donations to the camp from the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Perth and the Administrator of the Anglican Diocese of Perth.

If you are up to travelling the 200 or so kilometres to Narrogin, please join us in worship at the Church of the Resurrection (Anglican), 9 Park Street, Narrogin at 6pm on Saturday, 8 July 2017, and at St Matthew's Church (Roman Catholic), 99 Earl Street, Narrogin at 9.30 am on Sunday, 9 July 2017.

One of the pieces being learnt at Camp is a setting of the Mass composed by myself. All members of the Branch have the opportunity to make their own judgements about the quality (or otherwise) of this Mass by joining in our Choral Festival at St Patrick's Basilica, Fremantle in August (and, of course, the two rehearsals prior to the performance). The details are in this WestNews; please do put them in your diary now.

Once Branch Committee resumes meetings in August, a major part of its work will be to devise a program of events for 2018. We warmly welcome input from people who are not presently on Committee. Please tell us events that you would like to have us put on. That's a much better way of doing things than the Committee trying to work out what our membership would like to do. You will find this as a repeating theme over the next few numbers of Westnews.

Please do also note the dates for two events both taking place in October and November. These are a great opportunity not only to do some worthwhile singing, but also to make renew acquaintances with fellow RSCM people.

Steven Secker and I represented our Branch at the May meeting of the National Council of RSCM Australia, together with Jacinta Jakovcevic, who has been co-opted onto Council with particular responsibility for encouraging youth participation in RSCM. It was an interesting time, not least arriving back at our accommodation on the second evening to find that a group of young men had moved in to our apartment. Apparently a junior staff member had mixed up the issuing of keys! Of more importance to our Branch is the news that South Australia sustained something of a loss on the January Summer School; musically it was a great success, with Malcolm Archer and his team providing great leadership. They are at a point where they cannot guarantee that they will be able to host a Summer/Winter School when it comes to their turn. This in turn will affect the future program of RSCM Australia.

That will be one topic for our next Annual General Meeting. Sheila Byfield indicated this year that she was accepting the role of Treasurer for this year only; hers would normally be a two-year term. That is a role that needs to be filled at the 2018 AGM; please consider whether you are being called to take on this responsibility.

I look forward to continuing to meet with our members as we work together to help our various churches achieve the best possible standard in the music that they offer to the glory of God.

GOSPEL SINGING WORKSHOP AT ST. BARNABAS

What fun to be had on a quiet Sunday afternoon on the last day in April. A congregation of more than 40 heartily joined in to all the singing led so enthusiastically by Louise Bell accompanied by Sarah Mills Menogue on piano and later led by Celia Mayers of the Mothersong, the Loftus Community Choir.

Divided into the usual choral groups – SATB – members were encouraged by Louise to sing with all the spirit of Negro Gospelists: moving bodies, clapping their hands for the spirituals: "Let it shine", "Better'n one day …" and "One more time …" without benefit of a printed score. Celia added to the day with her conducting of "Come along my friends …". At first confusing, then challenging, the groups rose to near perfection by the final presentation. Items by St Barnabas' Singers and the Mothersong Loftus County Choir rounded off a very pleasant stimulating afternoon. JOHN NICHLSON IRELAND. (13th August 1879 – 12th June, 1962)

The day following our Fund-raising concert was the 55th anniversary of the death of this English composer and teacher of classical music. The majority of his output consists of piano miniatures and songs with piano accompaniment, although he composed Chamber works and Church music as well, including several Evening Services and 2 Communion Services. He also composed the music for the film The Overlanders in 1946, and some orchestral and organ music. His best known works include the hymn "The Holy Boy" a setting of the poem "Sea Fever" by John Masefield (sung at our concert by Derek Sloan) and the motet "Greater Love Hath No Man" - a choral standard.

On 10th September 1949, his 70th birthday was celebrated in a special Prom concert, at which the Australian pianist, Eileen Joyce, who was also the first pianist to record this concerto in 1942, played his Piano Concerto. Alan Rowlands, whom Ireland met in Sussex, where he lived in a converted windmill, recorded his complete piano music. He is buried at St Mary the Virgin Church in Shipley, near his home. His epitaph reads, "Many waters cannot quench love" and "One of God's noblest works lies here"
