As communicated back in March, we've been left no choice but to cancel a number of key events this year. I met via teleconference with part of the national council and we collectively decided to postpone our national winter school originally scheduled for July 2020 to the same time in 2021, which in turn means that the Perth winter school will also be pushed back to 2022.

Around the same time, we decided to take the same approach with our WA choir camps, and Great Southern Grammar graciously allowed us to push back our booking for Albany until next year, as well as offering to return our deposit.

As such, we've cancelled all our larger events for 2020, and put the small events "on hold" pending rescheduling once we get some guidelines from the WA government about when it would be prudent to restart them.


